TERRY'S TOP TIPS

Extracts from the Chestnut Newsletter

Our first question this week asked if Tack Cloths are considered food safe. A refurb project on a rolling pin was being planned, was it safe to wipe the surface with the Tack Cloth to clean it after sanding?

The sticky part of the Tack Cloths is a hydrocarbon resin, which if transferred onto the wood wouldn't food safe... BUT the tack cloths are designed to collect dust off the surface and not leave any residue behind, so unless the wood is scrubbed hard with a tack cloth—which it shouldn't be—this won't happen.

So in short, under normal use, the Tack Cloths are food safe.

Another question asked about UV protection, and which of our products have UV filters in them? UV filters help protect a finish from the sun's rays, and will also help slow down the bleaching effect of the light. Only exterior finishes really need this

protection, so our Finishing Oil, Acrylic Gloss Lacquer and Acrylic Satin Lacquer include these.

Our Spirit Stains are inherently highly fade resistant, using any of the products above will help them keep their colour even longer.

At a recent demo, a question was asked which was why 'toy safe' didn't also mean food safe. I believe there are lots of reasons for this, but the most compelling are especially relevant for fruit being kept in a wooden bowl, but apply to many other situations:

- Foodstuffs in a bowl are likely to be there for longer; days, maybe even weeks. This allows more time for any contaminants to transfer into them.
- Fruits, especially, contain acids etc which could react with the coating and encourage something unpleasant to cross over.

I always think we probably worry too much about this issue, but when asked about it, we always provide as honest an answer as we can.

"What's the difference between Ebonising Lacquer/Ivory Lacquer and a normal paint?" we were asked recently. It's a fine, but important, difference between them. A lacquer is usually harder wearing than a paint.

More importantly, these lacquers are heavily pigmented to give their colour, but not so much as to obliterate the grain, which was always the intention. This means the lacquers follow the contour of the grain, colouring them without hiding them, and allowing the use of Liming Waxes and Rainbow Waxes etc on top of them, to highlight the grain beautifully.
